# The Real Hays?

The characters in tonight's play, George and Charlotte Hay, display all the extremes of the 'theatrical couple' sterotype - self-importance, grasping ambition and petty jealousy. There is no suggestion they were based on real characters.

But there really was a star husband-and-wife acting team that dominated American theatre for three decades - Alfred Lunt and Lynn Fontanne; a couple whose achievements resonate with those of our loveable reprobates.




Alfred Lunt first set foot on a Broadway stage in 1917, and two years later scored his first significant success as the title character in Clarence. In 1922, he married British actress Lynn Fontanne, and for the next 35 years the team of Lunt and Fontanne reigned on Broadway.

Their string of stage successes included Amphytrion 38 and Idiots' Delight, not to mention their sublime collaborations with actor/playwright Noël Coward (Private Lives, Design for Living). Outside of a guest appearance in 1943's Stage Door Canteen, Lunt and Fontanne appeared together onscreen only once, in a 1931 adaptation of their stage success The Guardsman, for which they both received Academy Award nominations. Other stage hits included Pygmalion, There Shall Be No Light and The Visit, which saw the couple acting together until 1960.
