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ABOUT THE PLAY

'The Entertainer' was first performed at The Royal Court Theatre in 1957 with Laurence Olivier as Archie Rice. Like Osborne's previous play 'Look Back In Anger' (1956) it manages to combine a basically domestic plot with an explorations of much wider social issues.


In the pathetic and seedy inadequacy of Archie Rice and his family, Osborne sees reflected the general inadequacy of Britain in the fifties. Likewise, the decay of the music hall and the variety theatres seems to represent the general decay of post-war British society.

Like Jimmy Porter in 'Look Back In Anger', Archie is intelligent enough to see through the sham and rather sordid world he is forced to inhabit but too weak to put it to rights and too doubting to see beyond it. Archie abdicates from real responsibility either to his family or his profession, and resorts to cynical and destructive self-analysis, songs about patriotism and normality and large doses of gin.

Whatever reservations modern audiences may have about Osborne's elaborate metaphor about life in the fifties and the accuracy, or otherwise, of his analysis, there is no doubt the part of Archie Rice is one of the great theatrical roles of modern theatre.


